



Welcoming former International Mountain Bicycling Association (IMBA) members to the NSP – April 2018

Bike patrollers who are presently members of IMBA and affected by IMBA's change in strategy can become members of the NSP in one of three ways: joining as a traditional member of a patrol unit, joining as an associate member of a host unit, or joining as an independent associate member. All current bike patrol groups will need to form as Patroller Units or Bike Host Units. Talk to your current patrol leader to learn which type of unit your patrol will form.

NSP members pay dues on a calendar year basis (January 1 through December 31st). IMBA members can join the NSP at a prorated rate for the 2018 calendar year. Please note: current IMBA memberships do not transfer to the NSP.

Join in April: \$15.00

Join in May: \$10.00

Join in June: \$5.00

Billing for 2019 (Jan-Dec) begins in July 2018 and payments are due by Dec 31, 2018. NSP 2019 national dues differ based on the type of membership listed below.

1. Join a Patroller Unit

- a. New members of bike Patroller Units need to create a personal account on the NSP website, then they will be added to the patrol roster by their patrol representative.
- b. New bike patrollers are subject to all applicable provisions in the Policies and Procedures.
- c. Completion of Outdoor Emergency Care (OEC) is required for patrollers, along with annual refresher completion and demonstration of Professional level CPR skills. There is a \$60 course fee for OEC paid at the time of enrollment.
- d. For the 2019 dues year, patrollers pay national dues of \$55 and may have division, region and local dues.
- e. Patroller benefits include
 - i. An annual subscription to *Ski Patrol Magazine*.
 - ii. The ability to purchase all NSP Online Store items

- iii. Access to all Pro Deals
 - iv. The ability to participate and be credentialed in NSP training or education programs.
 - v. Comprehensive support services.
 - vi. Online resources.
 - vii. Annual updates.
3. Join a Bike Host Unit (Pilot Program approved by the NSP Board)
- a. New Bike Host Unit members need to create a personal account on the NSP website, then they will be added to the host unit by the unit representative.
 - b. Hosts are subject to all applicable sections of the Policies and Procedures.
 - c. Completion of Outdoor First Care (OFC) is required for hosts. There is a \$25 course fee paid at the time of enrollment. Community level CPR is also required for hosts.
 - d. For the 2019 dues year, hosts pay national dues of \$55. Hosts do not pay division or region dues.
 - e. Host benefits include
 - i. An annual subscription to *Ski Patrol Magazine*.
 - ii. The ability to purchase all NSP Online Store items except ski patrol uniform-specific items.
 - iii. Access to all Pro Deals, excluding Black Diamond
 - iv. The ability to participate and be credentialed in NSP training or education programs.
 - v. Comprehensive support services.
 - vi. Online resources.
 - vii. Annual updates.
4. Become an associate member
- a. Individuals who do not choose to join a traditional patrol or associate host unit, or whose prior IMBA patrol chooses not to become an NSP patrol or host unit, can become associate members.
 - b. Associates are subject to all applicable sections of the Policies and Procedures.
 - c. Associate member dues are \$60 annually. There are no division or region dues for associates.
 - d. Associate member benefits include
 - i. An annual subscription to *Ski Patrol Magazine*.
 - ii. The ability to purchase all NSP Online Store items except patrol uniform-specific items.

- iii. Access to all Pro Deals, excluding Black Diamond and K2, and including limited Patagonia discounts.
- iv. The ability to participate and be credentialed in NSP training or education programs.
- v. Comprehensive support services.
- vi. Online resources.
- vii. Annual updates.

Other pertinent items:

- A. Instructor Training
 - 1. The current IMBA Patroller Instructor Training will not be continued at the NSP.
 - 2. New NSP bike patrollers or hosts are welcome to participate in the NSP instructor training process that begins with the Instructor Development course and associated mentoring/observation.
- B. Gear
 - 1. The NSP does not specify uniform requirements. Those are determined by area management.
 - 2. The NSP Online store offers a wide variety of bike jerseys, socks, helmets, jackets and other gear for purchase by members at substantial discounts. New cycling items will be available on May 1st.
 - 3. The NSP does not send out socks with membership, but there are plenty of savings available in the NSP Online store and NSP Pro Deals page.
